Gediminas Castle Tower



In the capital of Vilnius, Gediminas Castle Tower is the only remaining fort tower of the Upper Castle first built by Gediminas, the Grand Duke of Lithuania at the end of the 13th century.

Trakai Island Castle



Located on an island on Lake Galvė, Trakai Island Castle was an important defensive structure in the 15th century. Today, it is a popular tourist destination with many activities around the lake.

Hill of Crosses



The Hill of Crosses is a collection of over 200,000 wooden crosses built on a small hill in Northern Lithuania and is one of the most spectacular sights in the Baltic countries.

St. Anne's Church



St. Anne's Church in Vilnius' Old Town was established around 1500 and is a prominent example of both Flamboyant Gothic and Brick Gothic styles.

Anykščiai Regional Park



Anykščiai Regional Park covers 15,000 hectares where you can find a complex tree-canopy trail and a walkway with an observation tower.

Curonian Spit National Park



Curonian Spit National Park is a sand peninsula that separates the Curonian Lagoon from the Baltic Sea and is home to the highest moving sand dunes in Europe.

Say **Taip** to Lithuanian



Lithuanian breakfast (*pusryčiai*) is always served with a cup of tea or coffee and a white bread sandwich with butter and smoked or cooked sausage or various types of porridge.

Lunch (*pietūs*) is the most filling meal of the day usually served with a plate of soup and a main dish, mostly consisting of meat and potatoes.

For dinner (*vakarienė*) a light meal is served. For example, dairy soups, potato salads or potato pancakes are the most favoured meals. However, big dinners are served during celebrations such as Christmas Eve.



Šaltibarščiai

A cold summer soup with beets and milk kefir or sour milk, made with cooked or pickled shredded beets and various other chopped vegetables & herbs such as cucumber, dill, or green onions.



Cepelinai

A traditional Lithuanian dish made from grated and riced potatoes and stuffed with ground meat or dry curd cheese or mushrooms.



Kastinys

A traditional Samogitian (northwestern region of Lithuania) dish made from sour cream, curdled milk and butter with spices.



Kūčiukai/slīžikai

Small, slightly sweet pastries made from leavened dough and poppy seeds eaten separately or with poppyseed milk. This is a traditional Kūčios (Christmas Eve) dish.



Kepta duona

A simple Lithuanian snack consisting of fried sliced rye bread that rubbed with garlic or topped with cheese or mayonnaise.
