This 30-metre-tall statue is located on the top of Mount Corcovado in Rio de Janeiro and has become one of the most famous landmarks in Brazil.

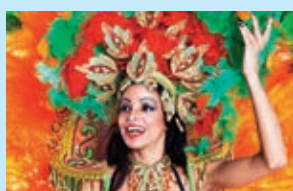
Gorongosa National Park

Gorongosa National Park is located in central Mozambique. Its forests and savannahs are home to lions, hippos and elephants.

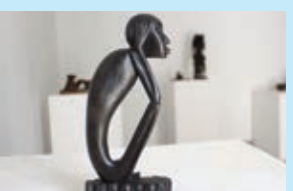
Cultural Aspects in Portuguese Speaking Countries

Pastel de Nata (Portugal)

Pastel de nata is a traditional Portuguese custard tart with a rich egg custard nestled in shatteringly crisp pastry dusted with cinnamon.



Feijoada

Feijoada is a stew of beans with beef and pork commonly prepared in almost all of the Portuguese speaking countries. The recipe differs slightly from one country to another.



Brigadeiro (Brazil)

Brigadeiro are bite-sized chocolate sweets. Some people say they are like bon-bons, other people say they are like truffes or fudge balls.



Pão de Queijo (Brazil)

Brazilian cheese bread is a small, baked cheese roll or cheese bun, it is a popular snack and breakfast food in Brazil.



Bacalhau com Natas (Portugal)

Literally translated as "cod with cream", is a popular way of cooking salted cod (bacalhau) in Portugal. It is an oven-baked dish with layers of bacalhau, onion, diced fried potatoes, and cream.



Mufete (Angola)

Grilled fish mixed with beans, palm oil, boiled plantains, boiled sweet potato, cassava flour and the mufete sauce (a sauce with chopped onion, tomato, bell pepper, lemon, and olive oil).

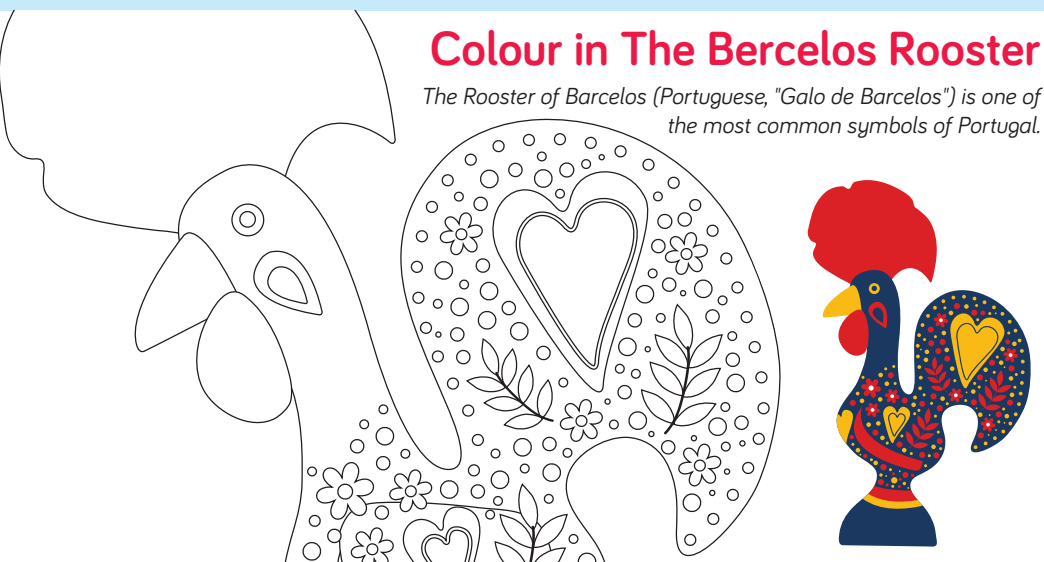
