Say **Sí** to Spanish



In Spain, breakfast (*el desayuno*) is the smallest meal of the day and usually light including coffee and breakfast biscuits or toast.

Tapas which are considered light canapés are eaten between breakfast and lunch. Lunch (*la comida*) is the biggest meal of the day with 2 or 3 courses of salad/vegetables/soup followed by meat/fish.

In the late afternoon, a snack (*la merienda*) is eaten around 4:30pm or 5pm. Dinner (*la cena*) is typically a lighter meal with smaller portions, eaten slightly later at 9pm.



Paella

A Spanish rice dish originally from Valencia. It can contain meat, fish and/or vegetables and is characterized by its use of saffron which gives it its unique flavour and yellow colour.



Tortilla

A Spanish tortilla is a traditional dish made with eggs and potatoes, it can also include onion. It is also known as a Spanish omelette and is often served as a tapa.



Enchiladas

Typically from Mexico, corn tortillas rolled around a filling & covered with a savoury sauce. Filled with ingredients including meats, cheese, beans, potatoes, vegetables or a combination of these.



Tapas

A tapa is an appetizer or snack in Spanish cuisine that can be served hot or cold. Tapas have evolved into a more sophisticated cuisine. Examples include patatas bravas and croquetas de jamón.



Churros

A churro is a fried-dough pastry, like a long crunchy doughnut. In Spain, churros are usually dipped in a hot, thick chocolate sauce.
