#ThinkLanguages Champion Team

We'd like you to appoint a **#ThinkLanguages Champion Team** of TY students and a **#ThinkLanguages Team Lead** (TY Coordinator or MFL Teacher) to help organise your event.

How do you Think Global and Act Local?

- > Your school can invite local speakers and businesses to take part and support your event. They may even organise a workshop!
- Why not showcase the languages that are spoken in your school and used in your community? Explore how people use different languages in their lives, workplaces and families.
- Maybe ask the Home Economics students to cook food from different countries and learn some new vocab that way!
- > Why not get some former students from your school who now study languages at Third Level to come in and tell you what it's like to study abroad?
- > Have you thought about sending TYs into your local Primary to share their language skills with the younger children? You could include this in your preparation for the event or even afterwards to share their experience of #ThinkLanguages.

This will help us put together the kit for your school and offer any extra advice and support you might need. **The link to the form will be shared with Team Leads of all registered schools and made available on languagesconnect.ie**See pages 18 to 19 of this brochure to help you develop your plan.



The event - Monday 22nd November

An online opening ceremony will kick off the day and festivities. Live workshops will be allocated to some schools based on their submissions.

Online workshops will be available to all registered schools.

What we will provide Before the day

Languages Connect will provide you with support to plan and set up your day. Planners, videos, online workshops and promotional materials will all be provided.

- Our videos from #TL previous years provide inspiration and ideas about what could work well as a local workshop in your school.
- > Ideas about who / what might work as part of your local event.
- Recommendations for putting your #ThinkLanguages Champion Team together and the tasks list for each team member.
- > Draft event planners that can be edited to fit your needs.
- > Ideas for what to research in your community /school / locality to best understand which languages are used by your students / teachers / families / local businesses.
- > The opportunity to register your interest in having a live workshop in your school.

- > Descriptions of the pre-recorded workshops.
- > Promo material e.g. speech bubble photo props, badges, pens, etc will be sent to your school once you have submitted your draft plan. These will add excitement and colour to the events.
- > Suggestions of how to combine languages with other talents in your school in a fun and engaging way to add more to your event such as art, cooking, singing, dancing, sport, acting and multi-media.
- Tips on how to promote your event locally before, during and after the day.



What we will provide On the day

Have fun being one of the many schools throughout Ireland simultaneously taking part in a national celebration of languages on Monday 22nd November.

An online opening ceremony will kick off the day. Every school, including yours, can start their event at the same time by watching the opening ceremony. Think about where you would like to view the opening ceremony, it could be in your classroom on a whiteboard, a large screen or tablets.

Subject to COVID-19 guidelines there will be a number of live workshops taking place in schools throughout Ireland.

Live workshops will be allocated by the end of October to some schools based on their submissions. Recorded workshops will be available on the #ThinkLanguages Event Hub website.

A final round-up will finish off the day where we will bring everyone back together to thank you for your involvement and wish you luck in your future language learning journeys.






What we need from your school Before the day

Your school's #ThinkLanguages **Team Lead** (teacher/TY coordinator) has registered your school to take part. It is important to submit your **draft event plan by Friday 22nd October.**


- > Start with appointing a #ThinkLanguages Champion Team.
- > Your #ThinkLanguages Champion Team will need to conduct research on local students, parents, businesses, etc and organise who could speak at your school's event.
- > Your team will produce an event plan to include allocated times for the online workshops scheduled in the morning and afternoon. You can fill the remainder of the day with local talks, workshops and activities.
- > Your team can promote the event on school, local and regional media channels e.g. school social media, websites, newsletters, local press and radio.



What we need from your school On the day

Your #ThinkLanguages Champion Team will need to set up the room for the workshops. You will need a large screen or whiteboard so everyone can view the main speakers and videos throughout the day.

- > You will need a tailored plan for your school for the day to cater for all students who are taking part.
- > Create a positive buzz and excitement in the school surrounding the event.
- > Try to include some international food tasting this could be supported by other students, teachers, parents and local businesses providing food.
- > Organise a photographer / videographer to take footage during the day. This could be one of your team using their phone or the school camera. It could even be the local press.



#ThinkLanguages Champion Team and Team Lead

Encourage your fellow students and teachers to volunteer to be part of the school's #ThinkLanguages event.

With the help of the **#ThinkLanguages** Team Lead (Teacher/TY Co-ordinator), the **#ThinkLanguages** Champion Team will conduct research and organise all elements involved in running the event from scheduling to promotion and set-up. There will be all sorts of jobs to do – **so all kinds of talent will be required!**

This is a great way for students to have their ideas brought to life as they help you tailor the event to your school's requirements and facilities. The number of students in your team will depend on the size of your school and the number of attendees.





There are lots of fun roles!

To run a successful event, each of the #ThinkLanguages Champions will need to know their role and responsibility within your team. We have suggestions for different roles, explaining what is involved, to help you out. Depending on the size of your event, you might need one or more #ThinkLanguages Champion for each role.

#ThinkLanguages Champion Team and Team Lead

Research Manager

This role is all about investigating what languages are spoken in your school



Key elements of this role are gathering information to help plan the event and feedback from all attendees after the event to compile the Award submission. A starting point for the Research Manager is to find out:

- > If there are multi-lingual students in your school or students with parents who speak other languages.
- > If there are any students with parents or family friends who use a foreign language in their job.
- If there are any modern foreign language facilities (universities/ businesses) in your area that could become involved in the event.
- > Is there a local Italian/Polish/French restaurant/shop/club that would like to contribute?

Content Manager

This role is about deciding what type of events or workshops you want to include in your event.



Online workshops will be provided by Languages Connect and you may want to add local content to your event. A starting point for the Content Manager is to find out:

- > Which online workshops do the students in your school want to do. Check out the list and see which ones will suit beginner or intermediate level.
- > Are there students/parents/teachers who would be able to put on a live workshop in the school or give a beginner's class in their home language.
- > Would teachers of other subjects e.g. Art/Home Ec/PE/Geography attempt a class in another language as part of the event.
- > Would a multi-lingual student and/or their parent come to speak about the many benefits of speaking a foreign language.

Scheduling Manager

This role is about planning the day's events and arranging all



Planners will be available to download at languagesconnect.ie/ thinklanguages. Your school will have its own timings, content and number of attendees so a detailed timetable and plan will need to be drawn up. A starting point for the Scheduling Manager is to find out:

- > What time the event will start and end and when are breaks needed.
- > How long will each workshop/activity be.
- > If different small groups need to be in specific places at certain times for activities/workshops.
- > What time outside speakers are available to come to the school or join online.

Promotional Manager

This role is about promoting the event before, during and after the day.



It will involve promoting the event in your school and in the local community as well as getting support from students, teachers, staff and parents. A starting point for the Promotional Manager is to find out:

- > How to promote the event on the school's communication channels such as the website, social media, newsletter, whatsapp groups.
- > Where you can put up posters in the school and local community.
- > If the local press or radio will come and visit the school to take photos on the day or beforehand to help promote the benefits of language skills in the community.
- > How to generate a buzz and excitement around the event with your fellow TY students and throughout the school?
- > Find the draft press release on languagesconnect.ie/thinklanguages and adapt it for information about your school and your event. Make sure to take some nice photos on the day and share them with all the local papers!

#ThinkLanguages Champion Team and Team Lead

Facilities Manager

This role is about organising the set-up for the day to include rooms and equipment, etc.



The event will need to be run in line with current COVID-19 guidelines. So it's up to the Facilities Manager to know what those guidelines are and make sure everything works within them.

A starting point for the Facilities Manager is to find out:

- > The number of attendees and what size room/s they are going to be in.
- > If there is a big screen/speaker equipment in the room and if a microphone and stage is needed for local guest speakers.
- > The numbers of chairs/tables needed for stands at the event, (if you're planning any stands).
- How your team wants to decorate the room and school, including where posters/bunting will be displayed.

Outreach Manager

This role is about reaching out beyond the school community, supporting others and getting support for your event.



#ThinkLanguages is about acting both within the school and the community. It's up to the Outreach Manager to see if there are any opportunities for getting support for the event from others in the the local area. A starting point for the Outreach Manager is to find out:

- > If there are former students who have studied languages at Third Level or use their languages in their jobs who could come and do a talk in the school or online.
- About local businesses or industries that use languages that could do a talk in the school or online.
- > Is there an opportunity for the TYs to reach out to the local primary school as part of their #ThinkLanguages preparation? Would they go and teach some basic language to the pupils in their old school? Maybe do one of their live workshops or share their #ThinkLanguages experience in some way.

Ten Top Tips from Last Year's #ThinkLanguages Teams

- Plan, plan, plan! The more structured your day, the more language filled it can be.
- Have a checklist for the day. Divide students into groups and know what students are doing what workshop at each stage of the day.
- Check out the pre-recorded workshop descriptions and prepare any materials required in advance. Show your students the workshop summaries and have a vote to help you decide what to include in your day.
- Involve your school and local community by reaching out to speakers of other languages and asking them to do a lesson on the basics in their language.
- If you have guest speakers coming to your school, reserve a parking spot for them if possible.
- Keep all your own workshops at 30 minutes so they are easy to coordinate with the pre-recorded workshops provided by Languages Connect.
- Wear comfortable shoes on the day as you could be on the go all day if you have different workshops running simultaneously!
- Enjoy the build up! Have a countdown on school screens to generate interest within the school community.
- Share pictures of your day on Twitter to feel part of something big and to connect with other schools.
- Send photos and some info about your #ThinkLanguages Event to your local paper they will love having a story from the local school.

Planning your Event

Every great event starts with a good plan. With **#ThinkLanguages**, you get to create an event that is best suited to your school and facilities.

Plan the day

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We've put together an exciting programme. Keep visiting the LanguagesConnect.ie and social channels for updates.

Your first step is to create a timetable for the day, putting in your chosen workshops. Each workshop lasts 30 minutes. Once you have the core timetable completed, you can start adding your own special school-based activities.

Brainstorm ideas to make your event special.

You could:

- Invite parents or members of the community to talk about the benefits speaking more than one language.
- > Have a food tasting event.
- > Create fun quizzes and competitions for prizes.
- > Explore different music styles.

Add your ideas to the timetable to create the draft plan. This will allow you to allocate tasks to team members



Gather stories in the school and local community

There are many people in your school and local community who are fluent in more than one language. Your team's Research Manager can ask them to share their life story by speaking at your event or by taking part in a video. It can be as simple as asking them to answer these three questions.

- 1. Who they are.
- 2. What languages they speak.
- 3. What is great about speaking more than one language.

Their stories, from great career opportunities to keeping connected to family and friends worldwide, transform the idea of languages from being a school subject into a life-enhancing skill.


Look for support from local businesses

From food to sports, from art to entertainment, global culture is part of our everyday life. Your team's Outreach Manager can ask local businesses who bring global experiences into your local community to support the event. You could ask restaurants and food shops to provide food for food tasting events and shops to provide vouchers for prizes. Try to think of imaginative ways to involve them.

Finalise the plan

The Champion Team review the plan. Decide what you are keeping, what you are changing and what you are dropping. You can draw up a final timetable for the day. Make sure everyone knows what their role is and what will be happening and where it will be happening on the 22nd November. For example:

- 1. Where will you watch the opening event?
- 2. Where will you host talks?





Planning your Event

Ideas of how to plan your day

You should split your schedule up into 30 minutes sessions – don't forget to add in breaks and lunch!

Leave half an hour in the morning for the streamed opening ceremony from Languages Connect.

All workshops – recorded and live should be 30 minutes long.

Any local speakers should speak for approx. 20 minutes leaving time for some Q&A. (You might want 2 people to talk for 10 minutes each).

Live workshops will be allocated by the end of October.

Promote the event

There are lots of exciting ways to promote the event in your school. **Here are some ideas:**

- > Putting up posters.
- > Handing out leaflets.
- > Creating your own radio ad, to be broadcast throughout the school.

- > Contacting local radio stations and newspapers to get publicity.

Online Workshop descriptions and requirements

Arabic and Belly Dancing Beginner

Learn some basic phrases, numbers, etc in Arabic while doing an active belly dancing class. PE gear and a bottle of water highly recommended.

4. Danish and Design Beginner

A combination of design and Danish language for complete beginners. You'll learn about the importance of good design, how that ties in with "hygge" and create a traditional Danish cone for your Christmas tree. Worksheet, scissors and glue are required.

2. Chinese Art Beginner

Our interdisciplinary artist will help students create a beautiful mini-booklet with 8 Chinese characters, illustrated to help students remember what they mean. There's an introduction in Chinese, snippets of Chinese culture, and students will be shown the pinyin for the 8 characters, so that they know how to pronounce them, as well as what they mean.

5. French and Cuisine JC Level French required

This is a combination of home economics and French. The workshop is in French and students will have a recipe at the end of it which they can try out at home. Students need to have done Junior Cycle French to do this workshop.

3. Chinese language Beginner

A taster class in Chinese language for complete beginners. No worksheets or materials required. Students will come away with some words, phrases and interesting cultural information.

6. French and Fashion JC Level French required

This was filmed in Paris and is likely to appeal to anyone interested in fashion. We are invited into the world of haute couture and encouraged to look at clothing, where it comes from and how it can be upcycled. Students need to have done Junior Cycle French and there is an accompanying worksheet, students can even bring in an optional item of clothing for upcycling.

7. French and Natural Beekeeping JC Level French required

Beekeeping has recently become popular with lots of celebrities. This workshop is presented by a French beekeeper and brings together biology and French. Scissors and a worksheet are required, and students will have a French Warré hive at the end of the workshop. Students need to have done Junior Cycle French.

10. German, Kaffee und Kuchen JC Level German required

An Austrian home baker, with a background in hotels and tourism, takes students through the importance of the Wiener Kaffeehauskultur, and shows them how to make Linzerschnitten. Students will come away with snippets of Austrian culture and a recipe to try at home. The Home Economics teacher might even be willing to make it with them later in the week, but not in a 30 minute workshop.

8. German and Passive Housing JC Level German required

This is a combination of construction studies and German and focuses on passive housing. It is not essential to have done construction studies, but it is essential to have done German for the Junior Cycle. At the end of the workshop, students will understand the concept of passive housing, and have a model to reinforce the concept. A worksheet, scissors and glue or Sellotape are needed.

This was created by interpreters from the European Commission, the European Parliament and the course director of the only interpreting course in Ireland. It's not language specific and there is no worksheet. It combines guidance with MFL, and can be shown to a group of students who are doing different languages.

This is filmed in Germany, suitable for students who have done Junior Cycle German, and is an opportunity to find out more about Deutsche Brotkultur, something that is so important for Germans, it is recognized by UNESCO. Competitions and Prizes

All schools who take part in #ThinkLanguages and fill out their final submission by Friday 17th December will be eligible to become the National #ThinkLanguages Champion Team 2021.

The winning school will be informed in January 2022 and have the opportunity to enjoy a full day of live workshops in their school for everyone in TY.

The 2021 winning Champion Team will be chosen based on the #ThinkLanguages themes under the following criteria:

- > Think Understanding Diversity: Finding out about languages spoken in your school and community.
- > Think Improving Well-Being: Including all TYs in the event and maybe reaching out to other years within
