We encourage you to appoint a #ThinkLanguages Student Champion Team as well as a Team Supervisor (TY Coordinator or MFL Teacher) to help organise the event.

Business in the Community Ireland (BITCI) is a movement for sustainable change in business and has a suite of education programmes which build partnerships between schools and business in Ireland.

# Recruit your #ThinkLanguages Champion Team

To ensure success for your day, you will need a team to help organise your school's festivities.

#### Get your students involved!

#ThinkLanguages is a great way to get students involved in a school event, giving them the opportunity to bring their ideas to life and put their stamp on the day. The #ThinkLanguages Champion Team, along with the support of the #ThinkLanguages Team Supervisor, (Teacher/TY Coordinator), will organise all elements involved in running the festival. There are lots of roles to fill, so all kinds of talent will be required! We also encourage you to get other teachers and staff involved to help make the day a success.

We have provided some tools and supports to help recruit your #ThinkLanguages Champion Team and guide them on what tasks need to be completed to make your school's festival a success, including:

- Student sign-up sheet
- > Task cards
- Position lanyards

When students actively participate in event planning, they feel ownership and pride, becoming more engaged and motivated in learning. Taking charge of tasks deepens understanding and encourages initiative.



# Next Steps... Planning your Festival Lineup!

Now you know what's available from Languages Connect and our partners, it's time for the newly recruited Champion Team to get planning a celebration of languages and culture that best suits your school and facilities.

### Think Local!

A great place to start is to research students, local businesses, parents, and community groups and consider who could speak or provide a workshop about their culture or language learning journey. Perhaps someone could demonstrate how to cook cultural cuisines, play heritage music, or speak about what languages have meant to their career.

Don't forget to promote the event on school screens, display the posters provided, and ask the school social media manager to share content about the event. You could even invite a local photographer, radio station or news reporter to capture the day and share it with the wider community!





# Sample Festival Map / Location Key

# Host your Festival!

The planning is done, the lineup is confirmed, and the school is awash with a **#ThinkLanguages** Festival buzz as the day arrives!

On the day, there will be a few things the #ThinkLanguages Champion Team will need to do to ensure the festival runs smoothly.

- > Prepare relevant rooms where activities will be taking place
- Greet any guests when they arrive at the school
- > Check projectors and sound
- > Set up and test online activities
- > Plan how to distribute promo materials
- Take photos and videos and share online, making sure to tag @languagesconnect and @langsconnect\_ie using the hashtag #ThinkLanguages
- Celebrate and enjoy the special day you have created for the school!

# #ThinkLanguages Top Tips

### 5 Top Tips from last year's #ThinkLanguages Champion Teams

- Get the whole of TY involved! It's a great opportunity to find out more about the languages spoken by all of your classmates.
- Check out the pre-recorded workshop descriptions in advance of your event and prepare any required workshop materials early.
- Increase student voice by sharing the workshop summaries with students and by having a vote to decide what to include in your day.
- Be practical when organising your event. Do what you can but don't take on too much.
- Always follow your school's safety guidelines and think of what is possible within your own school space.

### 5 Top Tips from the #ThinkLanguages Teachers

- Attend the online Community of Practice to connect with other teachers hosting #ThinkLanguages, share tips and get new ideas.
- Keep your own workshops at 30 minutes so they are easy to coordinate with the pre-recorded workshops provided by Languages Connect.
- If guest speakers are coming to your school, reserve a parking spot for them if possible.
- Have a checklist for the day. Divide students into groups and know which students are doing which workshop at each stage of the day.
- Wear comfortable shoes as you could be on the move all day if you have different workshops running simultaneously!

A select number of schools will be shortlisted for a visit on the day of their #ThinkLanguages event by our judging panel.

The top #ThinkLanguages Champion
Teams will be invited to an exclusive event in
January 2024 to chat with the judges about
their #ThinkLanguages experience. The
winning Champion Team will be presented
with the coveted prize at this event.
