Breakfast (Mic dejun) traditionally would include polenta, a side of bread served with jam, butter, or both, a healthy serving of eggs, fresh veggies, and cold cuts, much of which come straight from a farm or garden in rural areas.

Lunch (Masa de prânz) consists of soup, meat, potatoes, bread, and a vegetable, with wine or beer to drink. A special plum brandy, tuica, is also popular. Dinner (Masa de seară) tends to be similar to lunch, but less substantial. It is the most important meal of the day, when most families gather together to exchange daily news.

The Painted Monasteries of Bucovina are decorated with elaborate 15th and 16th century frescoes.



Known as the country's national dish, mămăliga is cornmeal-based porridge. You may know it by another name - polenta. However, unlike polenta, mămăliga is left to harden into a solid circle.

Is a traditional Romanian sweet bread, with a hint of citrus and a rich, nutty swirl running through the middle. Traditionally eaten at Christmas and Easter.


