The name "Romania" comes from the Latin word "Romanus" which means "citizen of the Roman Empire."

Corvin Castle



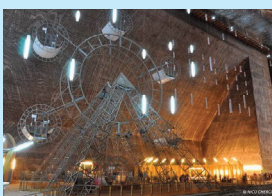
One of the largest Gothic-Renaissance castles in Europe and is featured as one of the Seven Wonders of Romania.

Say Da to Romanian

Breakfast (*Mic dejun*) traditionally would include polenta, a side of bread served with jam, butter, or both, a healthy serving of eggs, fresh veggies, and cold cuts, much of which come straight from a farm or garden in rural areas.

Lunch (*Masa de prânz*) consists of soup, meat, potatoes, bread, and a vegetable, with wine or beer to drink. A special plum brandy, țuica, is also popular.

Dinner (*Masa de seară*) tends to be similar to lunch, but less substantial. It is the most important meal of the day, when most families gather together to exchange daily news.



Sarmale (Romanian Cabbage Rolls)
Cabbage rolls are a traditional Romanian dish, filled with sour cabbage, ground pork, bacon, rice, onions, tomato juice, and some seasonings.



Mămăliga
Known as the country's national dish, mămăliga is cornmeal-based porridge. You may know it by another name – polenta. However, unlike polenta, mămăliga is left to harden into a solid circle.



Cozonac
Is a traditional Romanian sweet bread, with a hint of citrus and a rich, nutty swirl running through the middle. Traditionally eaten at Christmas and Easter.



Mucenici
Only eaten once a year on March 9th in a religious celebration of the Forty Martyrs of Sebaste. It's half pasta, half soup. It's naturally vegan-friendly and has a nutty, almost sweet taste to it.



Chiftele (Romanian Meatballs)
Chiftele, are flat and round meatballs made from minced pork, mixed with mashed potatoes and spices, then deep-fried. Chiftele is served with pilaf or mashed potatoes.
